Membership Categories and Fees

Full Individual Member (membres effectifs)

Description

Any person based in Europe who adheres to the purpose of EMMC ASBL can become a Full Member. Membership is subject to acceptance by the EMMC General Assembly. Membership can be withdrawn at any time by contacting the Association.

Benefits

Full members are core to the association and help drive the EMMC forward. In particular, they enjoy the following benefits:

- Voting rights at the General Assembly which is the ultimate seat of power of an association, with rights for example to
 - appoint directors
 - accept new full members
 - approve annual accounts and budget;
 - amend association statutes;
- The right to participate and vote in all committees and working groups; Working Groups will elaborate the various focus areas of EMMC, come up with recommendations and roadmaps etc. Only full members can take a leading role in these Working Groups, e.g. act as a Chair or Vice-Chair of an EMMC Working Group.
- Invitation to and close involvement with EMMC workshops and events. Full members are encouraged to propose and run EMMC workshops etc.
- Access to members-only resources that will be elaborated by EMMC ASBL.

Associate Member (membres adhérents)

Description

Any person member who adheres to the purpose of EMMC ASBL can become an Associate Member. Associate members have no voting rights.

Benefits

Associate members benefit from access to a wide range of documents and resources on the EMMC website, being kept up to date on EMMC activities and invitations to EMMC events, as well as the use of the EMMC online Forum for networking. The support of Associate members is important for the advancement of EMMC objectives and the EMMC is ready to receive their input and work with them on the development of a range EMMC activities.

Organisational Member (membres organisationnels)

Description

The organisation membership category is open and accessible to

- Any company interested in the modelling and digital representation of materials and integrated computational engineering with a presence in Europe.
- Any national association having its registered office in Europe and furthering the interests of modelling and digital representation of materials at national level ("national associations").
- Any legal entity interested in the field, including universities and research institutes with a presence in Europe.
- Other organisations may be accepted as organizational members subject to the approval of the Board of Directors.

Organisational Membership is critical to the success of the EMMC, helping to guide and support EMMC. Industrial End Users are key beneficiaries of advances in materials modelling and digital representation of materials and EMMC is ready to receive their input and work with them on the development of best practices, standards, roadmaps, staff training, policy development, etc (see EMMC Activities). Software Companies are the enablers of the industrial success by taking forward academic research into innovative software products. RTDs are the origin of key advances in modelling very much required by industry.



Benefits

Benefits of organisation membership of EMMC include

- Right to submit nominations for election to the Board of Directors;
- Right of organisational member employees to participate in all committees and working groups;
- Adding influence to their work on materials modelling in their sectors and markets.
- Having a voice inside EMMC, providing advice on the needs of their sectors and the problems faced in the adoption of materials modelling and digitalisation. In particular, attend Organisational Assembly meetings and vote on proposed policies for consideration by the EMMC Board and for members of the Organisational Advisory Board (OAB). Organisational member views are represented on EMMC Board through the OAB co-chairs.
- Access for all employees to all members-only resources (e.g. training resources or benchmark reports) elaborated by EMMC ASBL.
- OAB provides EMMC Board of Directors with recommendations for which resources should be provided to members and which types of events should be run etc.
- Being recognised on the EMMC Website and at EMMC Meetings as a supporter
- Receiving regular updates on the work of EMMC
- Interacting with other Organisational Members, for example in formulating collaborative research projects, facilitated by EMMC via its online Forum and Workshops.
- Discounts for employees to take part in EMMC workshops, in particular the flagship EMMC International Workshop.

Organisational Members must pay an annual contribution (see below) and are obliged to act in accordance with EMMC Statutes.

The Organisational Assembly

The Organisational Assembly (OA) is the body of representatives from the Organisational Members. OA meetings enables Organisational Members to help set priorities, hear about progress, and draw up recommendations from the Organisational Members.

The OA elects the Organisational Advisory Board (OAB), with its membership drawn from representatives of the Organisational Members.

The Organisational Advisory Board

The OAB advises the EMMC Board on adoption of materials modelling and digitalisation, organisational and process issues, overarching strategy, roadmap etc. At least one co-chair of the OAB serves as a consensus-forming but non-voting observer member of the EMMC Board of Directors.

How to become an organisational member

By email or letter to EMMC, FAO Executive Secretary (executive.secretary@emmc.eu), stating:

[Organisation name] is an [SME with less than 50 employees/SME/Corporation/RTD organisation] with an interest in the field of materials modelling and wishes to join EMMC as an organisational member starting as soon as possible. We agree to the aims and objectives of EMMC and to paying the annual membership fee, currently Euros.

Note: Acceptance of membership is subject to approval by the EMMC Board of Directors. Organisational Membership is annual and is renewed upon payment of an annual fee. An Organisational Member can leave EMMC at any time by giving one month's notice.

Categories and Membership fee

- Founding organisational member (for members signing up before 28 February 2020)
 - € 5000 for membership until 28 February 2020.
 - Will be noted on EMMC Website as Foundational members.
- General organisational member fees from 1 Jan 2020:
 - SME, less than 50 employees: €750 per annum
 - SME, less than 250 employees: €1500 per annum
 - Industry, >250 employees €3000 per annum
 - RTD (Universities and not for profit organisations): €1000 per annum

Note that the above rates are for specific geographical sites.
