- **3. Intended purpose**

- NIMS's Materials Data Platform is a collection of about ten different systems
  - Data Collection System gathers research data created by materials researchers, and adds metadata.
  - Materials Data Repository is the place for publishing the materials datasets, with metadata.
- All systems share a common metadata model, which can take values from a vocabulary service.
- Our vocabulary service uses Wikibase, the software behind Wikidata.

## 5. Upper level concepts

- No upper level concepts yet, taking bottom-up approach.

  - Structural features
  - Properties addressed
  - Characterization methods
  - Synthesis and processing



## 6. Use cases

- A user browsing a materials data repository can look for materials datasets using a search engine that's aware of synonyms, related concepts, and concept classifications.
- A text and data mining researcher can annotate or mine the literature using systems that are connected to the vocabulary engine, allowing for easier annotation or more semantic-aware text and data mining.

## 7. Overlaps with other taxonomies

- Our vocabulary overlaps heavily with NIST's Materials Vocabulary as we are building on top of it.
